

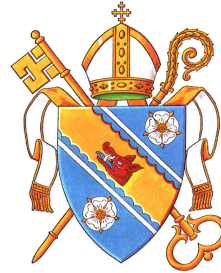

ORDINATION SERVICE ON SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 11

Fr. David Luckett asked yesterday how many of us have been present at an ordination service. If you have, you know how exciting – and moving – it is. If you haven't attended an ordination, then don't miss this one, the first ordination we've had here at St. Andrew's.

The liturgical color for ordinations is **RED**, just as for Pentecost: the **RED** reminds us of the Holy Spirit's fire. And, just as for our Pentecost custom at St. Andrew's By-the-Sea, the people are invited to wear something **RED** to mark this special celebration of Deacon Barry's ordination to the priesthood. Let's be a sea of **RED** on February 11!

INQUIRERS' CLASS

In mid-February St. Andrew's will have an Inquirers' Class. In this class, we will explore deeply what it means to be a Christian and a member of the church. We will look at the sacraments and church history. We will also look at our participation in our parish, diocese, and the larger church.

As we embark on our journey, we will use the Bible, The Book of Common Prayer, DVDs on selected topics of study, group discussions, and a book entitled *Those Episkopos* by Dennis R. Maynard. Our study will provide information for those who might want a refresher course following confirmation and for those preparing for baptism, confirmation, and reception. Bishop Duncan will be present on Wednesday, April 6, 2012, to celebrate the Holy Eucharist, baptize, confirm, and receive those who so desire.

We will begin one of our classes on Sunday, February 19, 2012, at 9:00 am until 10:00 am. Depending on our schedule, we may need to begin our Sunday morning class at 8:30 in order to cover the material needed. However, we will address the time issue at or after our first meeting. I also know there are some for whom Sunday mornings are not feasible because of choir or other duties and responsibilities. Therefore, I would like to know those who wish to attend the Sunday morning classes and those who need to meet at another time, perhaps one evening during the week. Once I know the number and needs of those who cannot meet on Sundays, another time can be arranged.

I look forward to hearing from you regarding participation in this class.
